

RESOLUTION 18-01

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CITY OF MARY ESTHER CITY COUNCIL, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIAL TO MAKE APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA, FLORIDA FISH & WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, City of Mary Esther is experiencing a need for physical improvements in one or more neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, City of Mary Esther is experiencing a need for economic improvement and sustainability; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of City of Mary Esther that local residents be assisted in creating an improved living and working environment in these areas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Mary Esther City Council authorizes the Mayor to act in connection with the grant and is authorized to sign correspondence and documents on behalf of the City;

SECTION 1. That the Florida Boating Improvement Program is declared to be a workable program for providing needed physical improvements to benefit the residents of Okaloosa County seeking boating and recreational opportunity.

SECTION 2. City of Mary Esther hereby directs the Mayor of the City to sign all necessary certifications of the FBIP application process.

SECTION 3. That City of Mary Esther directs the Mayor to execute and submit the FBIP application to the State of Florida, Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission for approval and in his absence directs the Mayor Pro Tem to execute the application and all subsequent documents.


SECTION 4. That the Chief Elected Official or the Mayor Pro Tem in his absence, is authorized and directed to submit additional information in a timely manner as may be required by the State of Florida, Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission.

SECTION 5. The proposed FBIP application is consistent with the local comprehensive plan.



SECTION 6. The City of Mary Esther will commit "matching funds" as required from local government funds to the FBIP project contingent upon funding from the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission. These funds will be spent in an addressed needs service area and will be spent after the date of the site visit and prior to administrative closeout. These funds are currently available.

SECTION 7. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
